

These are the words from the Lord's prayer in Matthew 6:9-13, taken from the King James Bible (Authorized version of the scriptures):-

9 Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name.

10 Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven.

11 Give us this day our daily bread.

12 And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer Words (traditional)

Our Father, which art in heaven,
Hallowed be thy Name.
Thy Kingdom come.
Thy will be done in earth,
As it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
As we forgive them that trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
But deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
The power, and the glory,
For ever and ever.
Amen.

A modern version

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours. Now and for ever. Amen.

Romans 8:26-28

²⁶Meanwhile, the moment we get tired in the waiting, God's Spirit is right alongside helping us along. If we don't know how or what to pray, it doesn't matter. He does our praying in and for us, making prayer out of our wordless sighs, our aching groans. ²⁷He knows us far better than we know ourselves, knows our pregnant condition, and keeps us present before God. ²⁸That's why we can be so sure that every detail in our lives of love for God is worked into something good.

Pathways into Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

- This is called the Jesus prayer.
- It is deeper than it first seems. It is a wide petition asking God to send his merciful presence.
- You can substitute the name of person for "me".
- Praying it repeatedly is a way to center yourself on God and block out other distractions.

Two prayers suggested by Wright.

Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, set up your kingdom in our midst.

Holy Spirit, breath of the living God, renew me and all the world."

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee O lord; And by thy great mercy Defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; For the love of thy only Son, Our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Shema

"Hear, O Israel, YHWH our God, YHWH is one; and you shall love YHWH your God with all your heart."

- This is called the Shema because the opening word in Hebrew is Shema (translated hear).
- It is not what we sometimes think of as prayer, but it is in the sense that it is an act of worship and commitment.
- You could also use Jesus' words on this topic.
